

CONSUMER PRICE INDEX (CPI)
August 2013: PRESS RELEASE

In August 2013, the overall CPI inflation was 0.09 percent, indicating an increase in the prices of consumer goods and services by 0.09 percent from previous month (July).

The inflation for August was mainly from the domestic goods and services which increased by 0.78 percent while overall price for imported goods fell by 0.61 percent mainly due to decrease in the price of kerosene and gas cylinder.

## **Monthly Consumer Price Index (CPI)**




Month-on-Month Inflation Rate: Overall, Domestic and Imported Goods and services

## Main Contributions to the Overall Monthly Inflation


At the 12 major group levels, the main contribution to the overall increase in CPI came from food & non-alcoholic beverages and clothing & footwear which recorded an increase of 1.79 percent and 3.87 percent respectively. Minimal increase was also recorded in other groups except in housing, water, electricity, gas and other fuel groups which fell by 4.73 percent due to drop in prices of kerosene and gas cylinder by more than 50 percent.

## Month-on-Month Percent change-12 Major groups




## The Year-on-Year Inflation

The year on year inflation was 5.51 percent (that is, from second quarter 2012 to second quarter 2013). The inflation in the same quarter a year ago was 13.53 percent.
