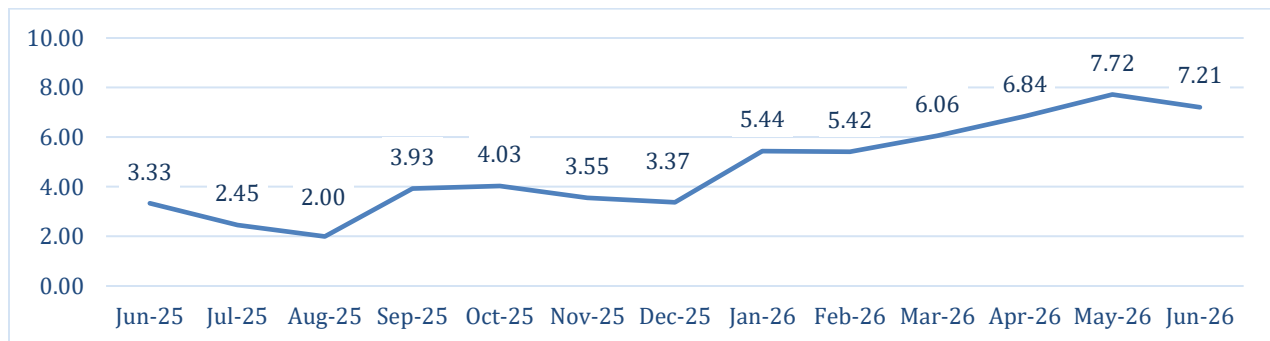

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY & KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Headline Inflation (Y-o-Y): Decreased to 7.21% in June 2026, down from the previous month due to a general slowdown in both Food and Non-food price escalation.
- Headline Inflation (M-o-M): Stood at -0.81% in June 2026, reflecting monthly price drops across key food products.
- Average Headline Inflation (Jan - Jun 2026): Recorded at 6.45%.
- Purchasing Power of Ngultrum (PPN): Stood at Nu. 51.7 relative to December 2012 baseline prices, representing a 6.73% erosion over the past year.

1. National Level CPI Analysis

1.1 Headline Inflation (Year-on-Year)

The headline inflation in June 2026 decreased to 7.21 percent year-on-year, primarily driven by a slowdown in price increments across both Food and Non-food indices. The average headline inflation for the first half of the year (January to June 2026) stood at 6.45 percent.

Food Inflation (Y-o-Y)

Food inflation recorded at 7.01 percent in June 2026. Within the Food category, the Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages index increased by 5.85 percent, while the Alcoholic Beverages & Betel Nuts index increased by 22.42 percent.

Non-Food Inflation (Y-o-Y)

Non-food inflation reached 7.55 percent in June 2026. Key drivers within non-food items include the Transport index, which climbed by 15.01 percent, followed by Housing & Utilities at 10.91 percent.

1.2 Headline Inflation (Month-on-Month)

On a month-on-month basis, national inflation decreased to -0.81 percent in June 2026. This downward movement was driven by index reductions in both Food (-1.51%) and Non-Food (-0.09%).

Food Inflation (M-o-M)

Month-on-month Food inflation dropped to -1.51 percent in June 2026. This downward trend was led by Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages (-1.57%) and Alcoholic Beverages & Betel Nuts (-0.77%).

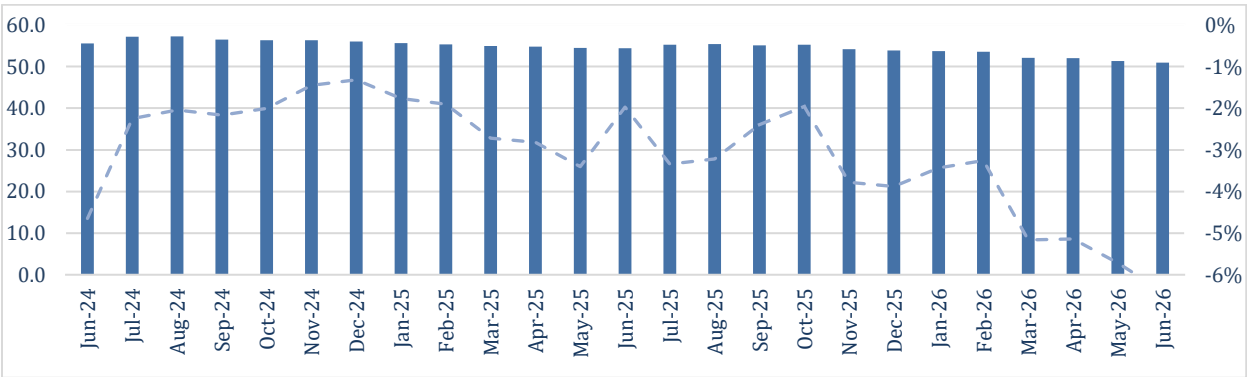
Non-Food Inflation (M-o-M)

Month-on-month Non-Food inflation decreased slightly to -0.09 percent in June 2026. The minor decline was mainly driven by Clothing & Footwear (-0.61%) and Restaurants & Culture (-0.33%).

1.3 Purchasing Power of Ngultrum (PPN)

The purchasing power of the Ngultrum (PPN), as measured by the CPI, stood at Nu. 51.7 as of June 2026 compared to the base period of December 2012. This indicates that Nu. 100 in June 2026 is equivalent to only Nu. 51.7 at December 2012 price levels. The purchasing power of the currency has eroded by 6.73 percent between June 2025 and June 2026 as a consequence of general price inflation.

2. Regional CPI Trends

2.1 Capital City CPI

Year-on-year inflation for the Capital City increased to 7.27 percent in June 2026, driven by a 7.39 percent rise in Food and a 7.17 percent rise in Non-Food indices.

- **Food Breakdown:** Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages increased by 7.03%, while Alcoholic Beverages & Betel Nuts fell by -12.77% Y-o-Y.
- **Non-Food Breakdown:** Driven by Housing & Utilities (+12.56%) and Restaurants & Hotels (+10.89%). Furnishings & Household Equipment dropped by -2.51%.
- **Month-on-Month:** Capital City inflation dropped by -1.49% M-o-M in June 2026, largely influenced by Food index declines (-2.71%).

2.2 Central Region CPI

Year-on-year inflation in the Central Region increased to 7.32 percent in June 2026.

- **Food Inflation:** Stood at 7.19% Y-o-Y (Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages: +6.16%, Alcoholic Beverages & Betel Nuts: +20.25%).
- **Non-Food Inflation:** Stood at 7.44% Y-o-Y (Housing & Utilities: +13.37%, Transport: +12.27%).
- **Month-on-Month:** M-o-M inflation decreased by -1.02% in June 2026, with Food falling by -1.75% and Non-Food falling by -0.31%.

2.3 Eastern Region CPI

The year-on-year headline inflation rate for the Eastern region increased to 6.64 percent in June 2026.

- **Food Inflation:** Increased to 7.51% Y-o-Y (Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages: +6.61%, Alcoholic Beverages: +19.55%).
- **Non-Food Inflation:** Increased to 5.64% Y-o-Y (Transport: +10.45%, Health: +10.42%).
- **Month-on-Month:** Headline inflation fell by -0.74% M-o-M, with Food decreasing by -1.47% and Non-Food rising slightly by +0.13%.

2.4 Western Region CPI

The year-on-year headline inflation in the Western region rose to 7.63 percent in June 2026.

- **Food Inflation:** Recorded an increase of 6.78% Y-o-Y (Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages: +5.27%, Alcoholic Beverages & Betel Nuts: +27.84%).

- **Non-Food Inflation:** Recorded an increase of 8.56% Y-o-Y (Transport: +15.34%, Housing & Utilities: +15.26%).
- **Month-on-Month:** M-o-M inflation fell by -0.74% in June 2026, driven by a -1.41% drop in Food and a -0.03% change in Non-Food.

3. Long-Term Trends & Annual Averages

The annual average national headline inflation from January 2025 to December 2025 increased to 3.50 percent, up by 0.69 percentage points from 2.82 percent in 2024. The upward trend was primarily supported by steady increases in both the food and non-food indexes.

- **Food Annual Average:** Average food inflation rose significantly to 9.39 percent in 2025 (compared to 0.48% in 2024), driven by a 9.96% increase in Food & Non-Alcoholic Beverages.
- **Non-Food Annual Average:** Non-food index inflation increased to 2.53 percent in 2025 (from 0.25% in 2024), led by Clothing & Footwear (+8.76%) and Furnishings (+6.30%). Transport and Communication indices saw annual declines of -2.93% and -0.56%, respectively.

5. Technical Notes

5.1 Background & Scope

The Consumer Price Index (CPI) measures relative changes in the prices of consumer goods and services acquired by households over time. It serves as a macro-economic indicator of inflation and cost of living adjustments. Prices are gathered across urban centers in 20 Dzongkhags at monthly, quarterly, and annual intervals depending on price variability.

5.2 Regional Baskets and Coverage

To ensure localized tracking of inflation dynamics, five separate CPI baskets are monitored monthly (introduced June 2024):

- National Basket: 169 items
- Western Basket: 165 items
- Central Basket: 144 items
- Capital City Basket: 134 items
- Eastern Basket: 120 items

Items are classified using the UN Classification of Individual Consumption According to Purpose (COICOP 1999). Approximately 500 representative outlets are sampled.

5.4 Reference Periods & Computation Methodology

- Weight Reference Period: 2022 (Derived from the Bhutan Living Standard Survey 2022).
- Index Reference Period: 2023-24 (May 2023 to April 2024 = 100).
- Price Reference Period: April 2024.

Index Calculation Formula: The CPI is calculated using the Geometric Modified Young Index Formula:

$$P_{GYo} = \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{P_i^t}{P_i^o} \right)^{s_i^b}$$

Where:

S_i^b = Expenditure Shares of the Base Period (weight from BLSS)

P_i^t = Current Period Price

P_i^o = Previous Period Price

$\left(\frac{P_i^t}{P_i^o} \right)$ = Price Relatives
