This bulletin covers price developments across major sectors of the economy, including Forestry & Logging, Mining & Quarrying, Manufacturing, Electricity, Transport, and Information & Communication. It focuses exclusively on prices of goods and services produced domestically.

The NSB extends its sincere appreciation to all government agencies, corporate entities, and private sector organizations for their continued cooperation and timely provision of data. Your invaluable support has played a vital role in the successful compilation and publication of this bulletin. We look forward to your continued collaboration in future statistical undertakings.

Highlights

Year-on-Year Inflation

Year-on-Year (Y-o-Y) inflation for April, May and June 2026, as measured by the Producer Price Index (PPI), stood at 2.30 percent, 3.16 percent, and 2.75 percent, respectively. This corresponds to an average annual increase of 2.73 percent in the second quarter of 2026 compared to the same quarter of the previous year.

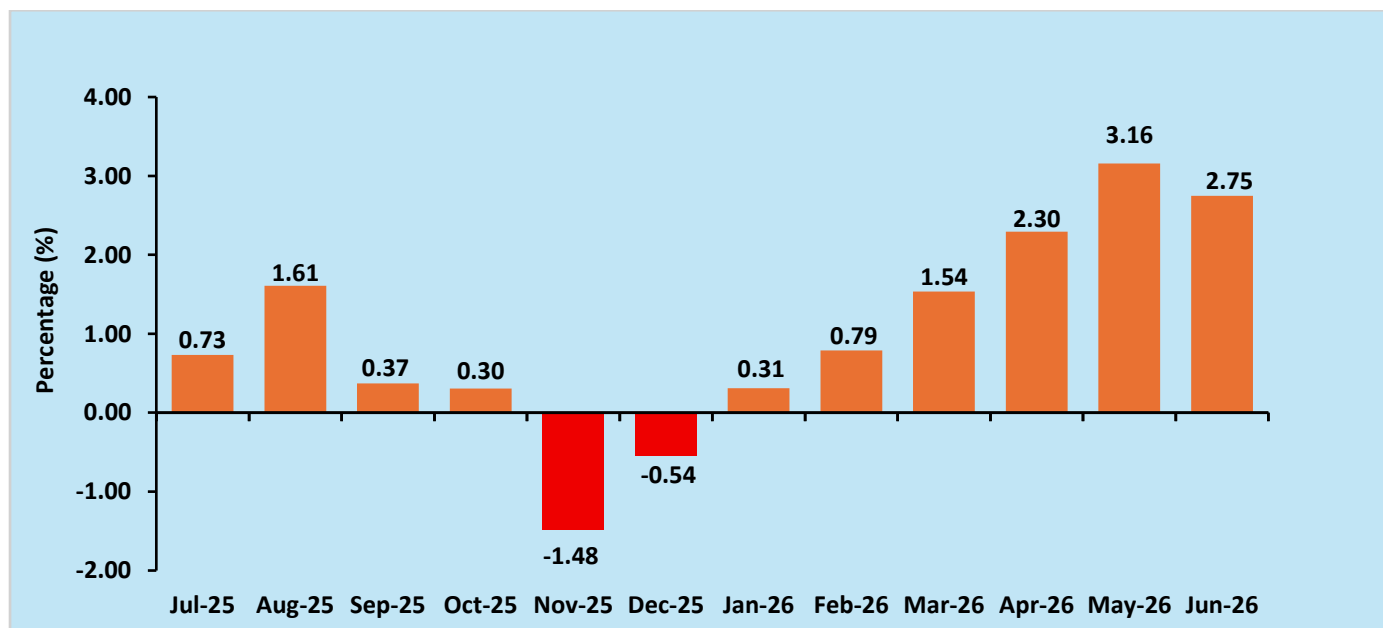
In the second quarter of 2026, the Forestry & Logging, Manufacturing and Transport sectors were the major contributors to the rise in overall inflation. The Transport sector experienced significant price increases, registering an average of 6.00 percent. This increase was primarily driven by public transport and postal services, both domestically and internationally.

The Forestry & Logging sector recorded a consistent Year-on-Year inflation rate of 5.14 percent during the quarter. This increase is largely attributed to the revision of Natural Resources Pricing Rates that took effect on 1st October 2025, which continued to exert upward pressure on producer prices within the forest sector.

The Manufacturing sector posted Y-o-Y inflation of 3.91 percent, 5.61 percent and 6.16 percent across the three months, primarily due to price increases in the manufacture of food products, beverages, non-metallic mineral products, chemical & chemical products, and basic metals.

On the other hand, the Electricity sector exerted downward pressure on overall inflation, recording Year-on-Year price declines of 3.46 percent throughout the quarter mainly driven by reductions in energy charges.

Month-on-Month Inflation

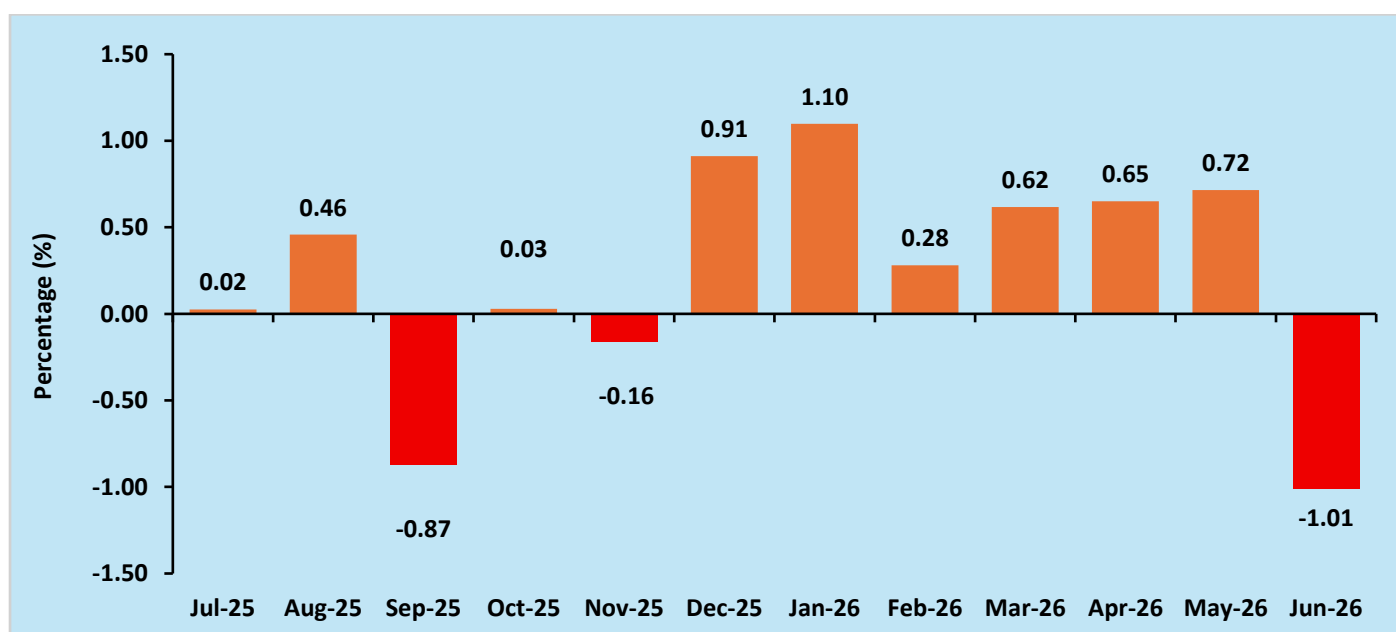
Month-on-Month inflation reflected minor fluctuations throughout the second quarter. The overall index stood at 0.65 percent, 0.72 percent and -1.01 percent in April, May and June respectively.

The Manufacturing sector recorded a notable fluctuation, 1.32 percent in April, 1.37 percent in May and -1.50 percent in June, reflecting short-term adjustments driven by changes in raw material costs and producer pricing strategies.

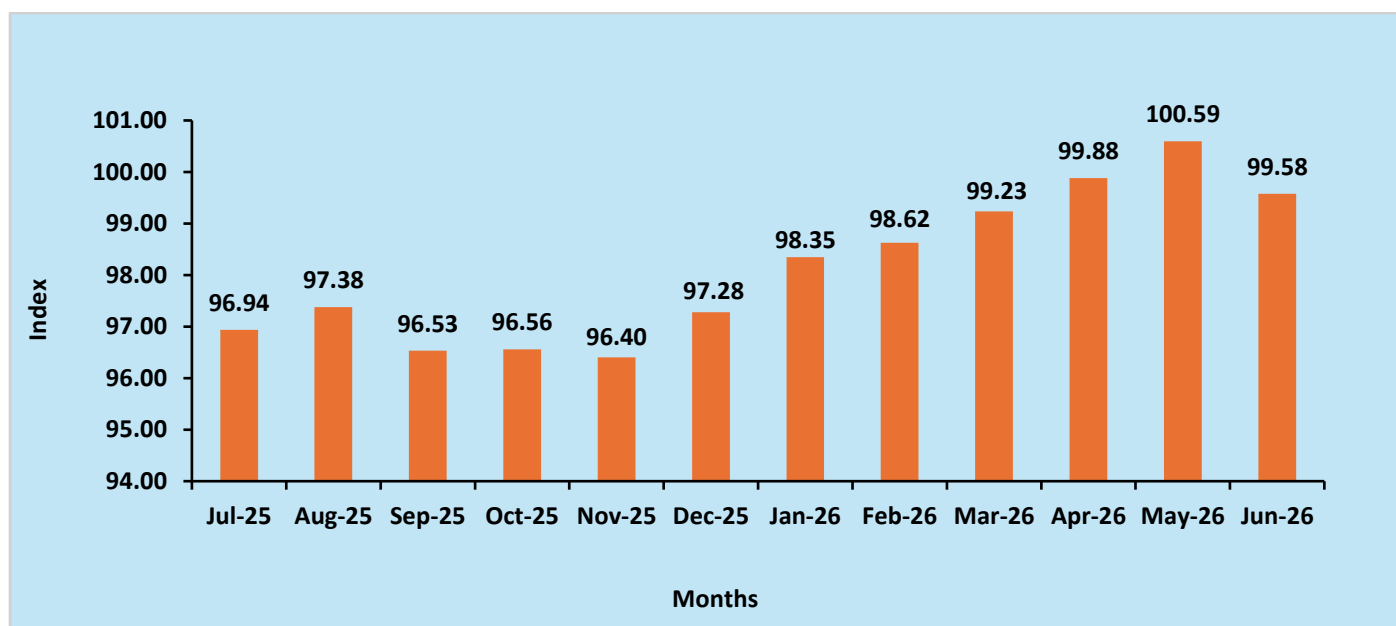
The Mining and Quarrying sectors recorded a 1.19 percent month-on-month increase in producer prices in April, followed by a much smaller 0.02 percent increase in May. However, producer prices declined sharply by 5.30 percent in June, indicating a significant fall in prices in the sector compared to the previous month.

The Transport sector recorded a 0.47 percent month-on-month increase in producer prices in April, followed by a stronger 1.21 percent increase in May. In June, producer prices decreased marginally by 0.05 percent, indicating that prices in the transport sector remained relatively stable compared with the previous month, after the increase observed in May.

Technical Notes

Definition

The Producer Price Index (PPI) measures the average change over time in the prices received by domestic producers of goods and services. It shows the average change in the prices of goods and services with reference to a particular reference period, known as the Index reference.

Scope and Coverage

The PPI covers domestically produced goods and services destined for domestic as well as export markets. The sectors included are logging, mining and quarrying, manufacturing, utilities (electricity and water), transport, and the Information & Communication sector. The PPI is classified and compiled by activity (BSIC rev. 4) and also by product (CPC rev. 2).

Reference Period

There are three “reference periods” used for the PPI, as given below:

- I. Weight Reference – the period during which the Economic Census of Bhutan (ECoB) 2017, carried out by the National Statistics Bureau (NSB), was conducted. The weight-reference period for the new PPI is 2017.
- II. Index Reference – the period when the index is set to 100. In the new PPI, the index reference period is January 2022.
- III. Price Reference – the period for which the prices of each product are used for calculating the elementary indices (indices for individual PPI items). The price reference period for the new PPI is January 2022.

Price Collection

Point-in-time prices are collected for the PPI compilation, i.e. the price of a product on the 15th day of every month, or the nearest trading day to the 15th of the month.

Index Calculation Methodology

The Geometric Modified Laspeyres formula is used for compiling the PPI:

$$P_{gyo} = \prod_{i=1}^n \left(\frac{P_i^t}{P_i^0} \right)^{w_i^b}$$

Uses of PPI

1. As a deflator in National Accounts to estimate the real growth rate
2. As a lead indicator of inflationary trends
3. Indexation of cost escalation in long-term contracts of goods and services
4. Business analysis
5. Current cost accounting

Calculating Index Changes

Movement of the price index from one month to another is usually expressed in terms of percent changes, rather than as changes in index points. Index point changes are affected by the level of the index in relation to its base period, whereas percent changes are not. The example below shows the computation of index points and percent changes.

Index point change

All Industries' Price Index	104.50
Less: previous price index	101.25

Revision Policy

If data are not received on time from the sources, the index published for that particular quarter is marked as “Provisional” and is revised and finalized when the next quarter's index is published.
